



“Business as Usual” To and From Europe

United Cargo is advising our customers that, with exception of some flights to and from Scotland, there is **no significant impact** on United Cargo’s operations from the recent eruption of Grimsvotn volcano in Iceland. It is “business as usual” to and from Europe.

Subsidiary Continental flights from Newark to Edinburgh and Glasgow were cancelled Monday evening due to concerns about volcanic ash in Scottish air space, and reciprocal flights from EDI and GLA to EWR will not operate on Tuesday. **All other** subsidiary Continental and United flights to and from Europe, the Middle East and Africa are planned to operate.

There are no current airport or air space closures associated with volcanic ash from the recent eruptions. While officials do not expect ash from the Grimsvotn volcano to cause the disruption in air transport caused by the Eyjafjallajökull volcano in April 2010, UA meteorologists continue to monitor the situation. If movement of the ash cloud impacts United Cargo operations in the future, we will issue frequent detailed updates on the situation.
